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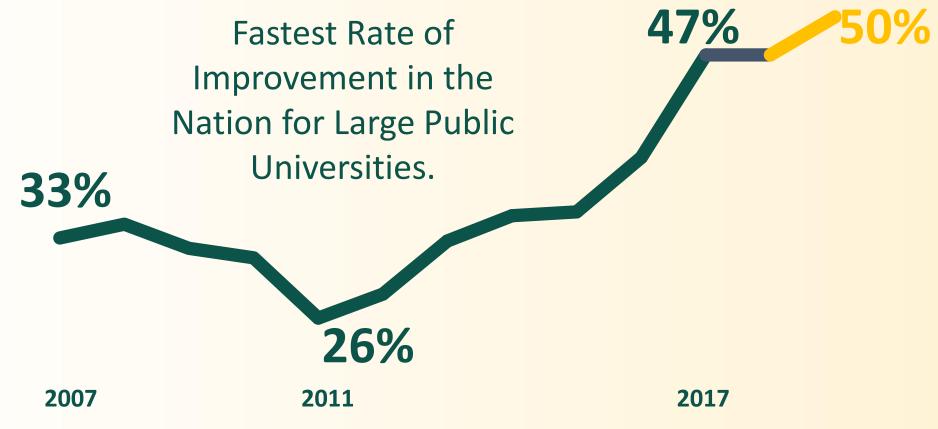
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The Motor City – Educational Drive

- Detroit: The comeback city with a whole bunch of "comebacker" potential
 - Over 690,000 students with some college, no degree
- Lumina Talent Hub designation 2018
 - Communities that show capacity to increase postsecondary credential attainment
 - Partnership created between WSU, Detroit Regional Chamber – Detroit Drives Degrees, Oakland University and Macomb Community College

The Larger Framework

- The Great Lakes State
 - Michigan is ranked in the lowest quarter in the nation for post-secondary degree attainment
 - Blue collar strength
 - Current Governor set a goal of moving 43.7% to 60% by 2030
 - National average = 47.6%
 - Lumina Talent Hub goal 60% by 2025 in all Talent Hubs

Collaboration is Key

- Association of Public & Land-Grant Universities (APLU) and Urban Serving Universities
 - Collaborative Opportunity Grant
 - WSU wanted the opportunity to work with our local Talent Hub partners to bring resources to metro Detroiters
 - When prospective students and/or stop out students think about reengaging with education, how do they proceed?



DetroitEd411

- Artificial powered chat bot available to answer questions about going back to school
 - Technology was a known resource and from a trusted partner
 - Utilized through Facebook Messenger
 - Average age of Facebook users
 - Free
 - Available 24/7
 - Has the potential to reach this population

 - Expand as a statewide resource
 - Michigan College Access Network
 - Governor's Education and Workforce Development team

 - Gather data
